# Self-isolation support for Swale residents:

Any Swale resident having to self-isolate as a result of a positive coronavirus test is now eligible to receive free practical support throughout the duration of their self-isolation period.

This is in the form of food parcels, medication pick-ups, wellbeing calls, dog walking, counselling, or any vital service necessary whilst the resident is having to self-isolate – all completely free of charge.

This support extends to the whole household of the resident who is selfisolating (regardless of income status or age) and will be of particular benefit to parents of school-aged children who may be struggling to cope whilst having to selfisolate.

Kent County Council and Swale Borough Council have currently funded this support to continue for residents until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021. Future support past this date will be communicated accordingly.

## Harvest:

We have received a letter from the Foodbank thanking us for our recent Harvest donations. The total weight of our donation was 143.4kg which equates to approximately 358 meals. Over the last twelve months Faversham Foodbank has feed 2535 individuals 1016 of these being children, giving out almost 23000 meals, as well as toiletries and household cleaning products. Thank you to everyone who donated.

# Football Tournament:

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## Information about Dangerous Toys:

A recent report commissioned by the British Toy and Hobby Association (BTHA) found many of the toys tested could choke, strangle, burn, poison and electrocute children. From the 255 toys that were randomly selected, inspected and tested, 88% were illegal and 48% were unsafe for a child to play with.

The toys tested were bought from a range of online sellers. Currently, there is no legal requirement for online marketplaces to check the safety of the products that other sellers are listing on their site.

The report itself includes a list of toys that researchers found were illegal or unsafe. As we move towards the Christmas season, when toys will be bought as presents, the advice given in Appendix 8 of the report, Consumer Tips, could be especially valuable.
