A251 Ashford Road, Faversham

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

TEMPORARY ORDER APRIL 2021

To allow proposed earthworks and utility diversions prior to traffic signal installation scheme starting in July 2021, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of A251 Ashford Road, Faversham.

A closure is planned from 5th April 2021, with estimated completion by 18th June 2021. The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signage on site and the works will be displayed on One.Network

A251 Ashford Road will be closed from the A251 Roundabout (opposite the new development) to the junction with Beaumount Davy Close, to the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.

Access to the Fire Station and to residential properties will be maintained at all times, with Gatesman on site at both ends of the closure 24/7.

A hard closure will also be in place on Salters Lane in the general vicinity of the Overbridge, to the extent indicated by signs and barriers on site.


Local diversion routes will be in place with appropriate signage on site.

The closures are required for the safety of the public and workforce while proposed earthworks and utility diversions prior to traffic signal installation scheme starting in July 2021 are undertaken by Kent County Council.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via A251 Ashford Road, M2 Junction 6 To Junction 7 On Slip, M2, M2 Junction 7 From Junction 6 Off Slip, Brenley Corner, A2 M2 J7 Roundabout, A2 London Road and Canterbury Road.

The alternative route for non-motorway traffic is via A251 Ashford Road, A2 Canterbury Road, London Road, Brenley Corner, A2 Trunk Road, A2050 Harbledown Bypass, Rheims Way, A28 Wincheap Green, Wincheap, Thanington Road, Ashford Road, Canterbury Road, A252 Maidstone Road, The Street, Canterbury Road, A251 to Sheldwich and vice versa.
